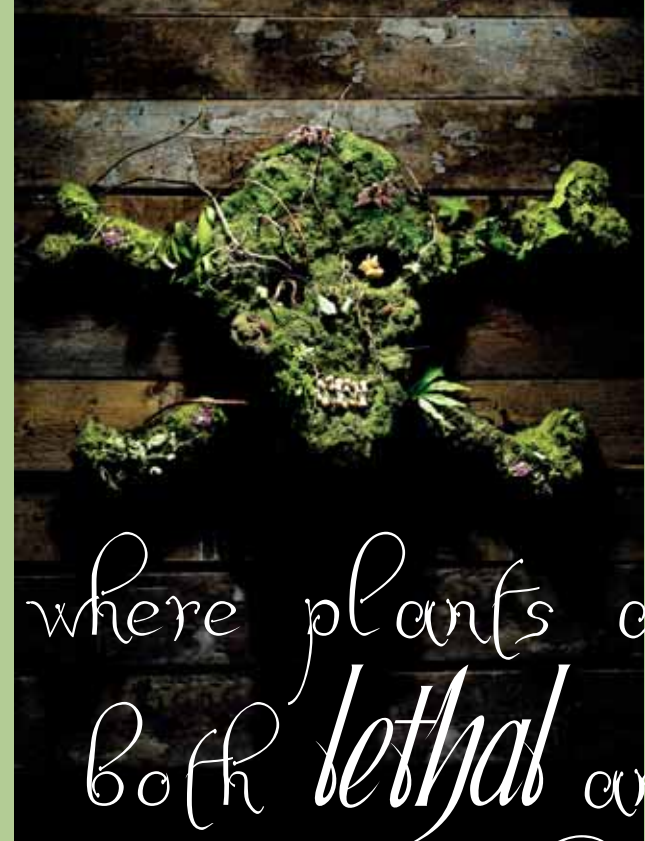

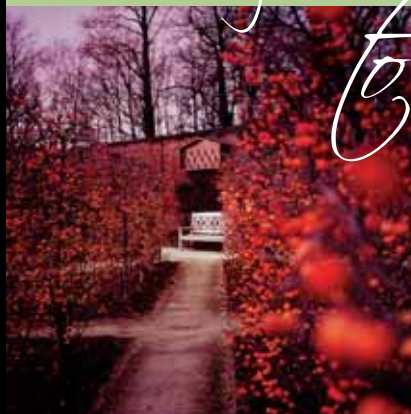

Spring brings a sea of pink tulips beneath clouds of white blossom in the Cherry Orchard, and in autumn enjoy the red glow of the crab apples and the chameleon-like change of the leaves. The Bamboo Labyrinth is evergreen, as is the topiary of the Serpent Garden where mirror-polished water sculptures reflect the Northumbrian winter sky

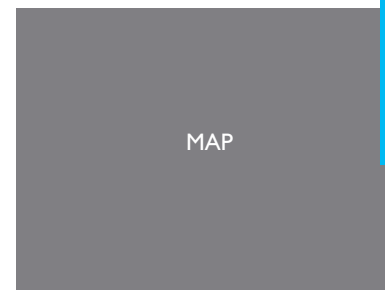
VISITING THE AREA

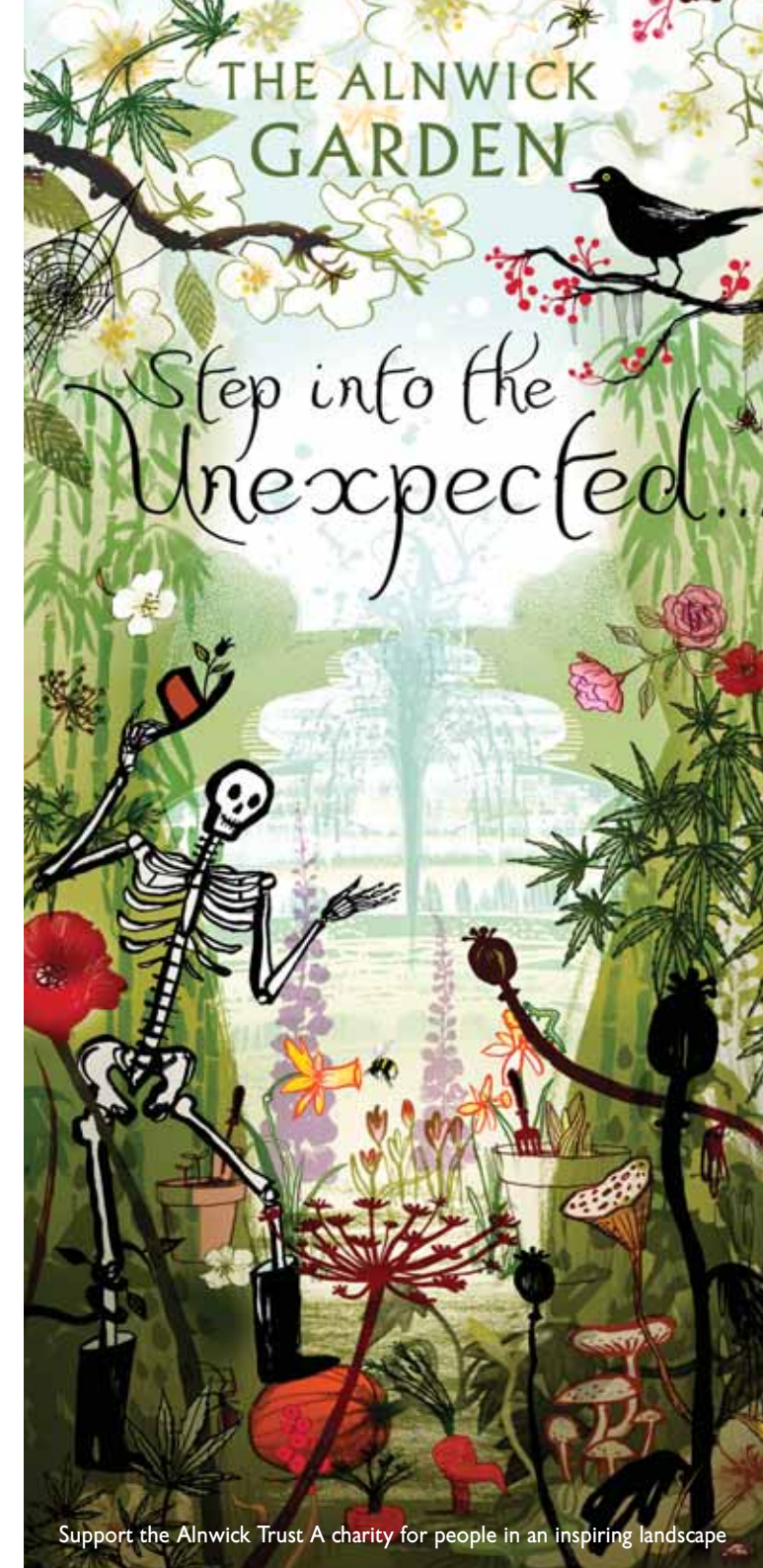
